In those days a decree went out from Caesar Augustus that all the world should be enrolled. This was the first enrollment, when Quirin'i-us was governor of Syria. And all went to be enrolled, each to his own city. And Joseph also went up from Galilee, from the city of Nazareth, to Judea, to the city of David, which is called Bethlehem, because he was of the house and lineage of David, to be enrolled with Mary, his betrothed, who was with child. And while they were there, the time came for her to be delivered. And she gave birth to her first-born son and wrapped him in swaddling cloths, and laid him in a manger, because there was no place for them in the inn.

Repeat, repeat the sounding joy.

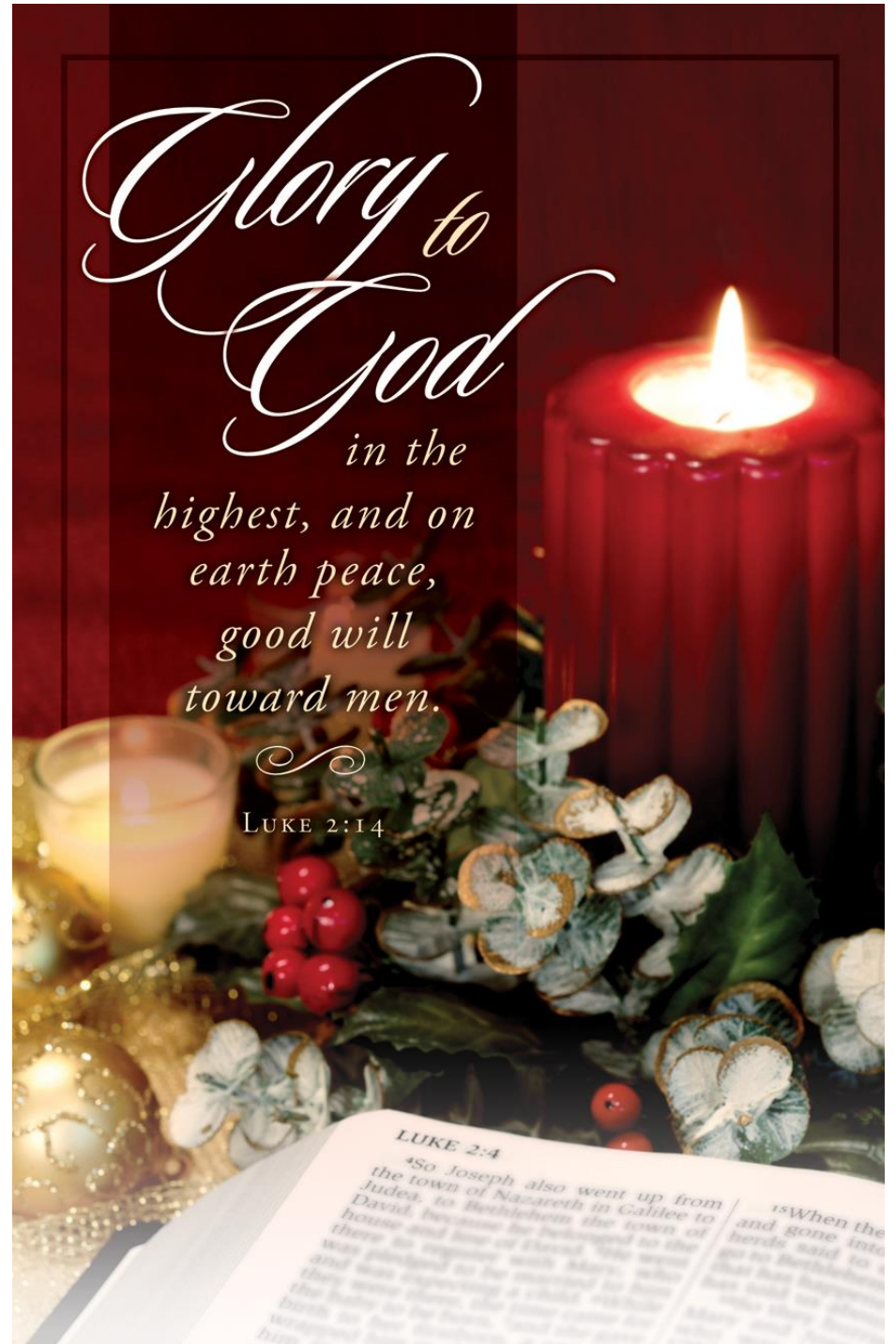
No more let sins and sorrows grow,

LUKE 2:4
4So Joseph also went up from the town of Nazareth in Galilee to Judea, to Bethlehem in Galilee to house and born of David. 5He went there in company with Mary, who then was expecting a child. 6While they were there, the time came for her to give birth. 7And she gave birth to her firstborn son and wrapped him in swaddling clothes and laid him in a manger, because there was no room for them in the inn. 8When the herds and gone into the field to feed their flocks, they saw their angel sitting on the manger and the baby lying in a manger. 9And they were terrified, but the angel said to them, "Do not be afraid, for I have brought you good news that will bring great joy to all people. 10For this is how it will happen: Mary will give birth to a son, and you will call his name Jesus, because he will save his people from their sins." 11All this took place to fulfill what the Lord had said by the prophet Isaiah: "Behold, I will bring forth a sign for you: A virgin will give birth to a son, and you will call his name Immanuel," which translated means, "God with us." 12The angels then departed from them, and Mary and Joseph were left with the baby in the manger. 13When the angels had gone, Joseph and Mary got up and took the baby and went to Egypt. 14This was to fulfill what the Lord had said by the prophet Hosea: "I will call my people out of Egypt, and I will bring them back to Israel." 15When Herod had killed the boys in Bethlehem and in its vicinity, Joseph got up with Mary and the baby and went to Egypt. 16He stayed there until Herod died, so that what the Lord had said by the prophet Jeremiah would be fulfilled: "A land of Egypt will be called, for I will say to my people, 'Go down to Egypt, for I will make you a people there.'"
